


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
Violence Against Women & Children

Prevalence & Effects of Violence Against Women



48% of U.S. women have experienced Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) in the form of psychological aggression.



24% of U.S. women have experienced IPV in the form of severe physical violence.

85% of domestic violence victims are women.





A recent study of homeless families in three types of housing programs found that 93% of mothers experienced at least one trauma and 81% experienced multiple traumatic events.

79% experienced trauma in childhood, 82% in adulthood, and 91% in both adulthood and childhood.



Alarming Impact of Domestic Violence

Between 22% - 57% of all homeless women report that domestic violence was the immediate cause of their homelessness.

38% of all domestic violence victims become homeless at some point in their lives.



19% of intimate partner violence involves a weapon.

From 2016 through 2018 the number of intimate partner violence victimizations in the United States increased 42%.





Domestic violence is more common among pregnant women than preeclampsia and gestational diabetes

A study of 3,400 shelter residents in domestic violence programs across eight states found that housing is one of the main needs identified by survivors at the time of shelter entry; 84% participants reported that they needed help with finding affordable housing.

Women are victims of physical assault by an intimate partner each year.
